

HOW CAN YOU HELP?



- Reading 4 times a week. Please evidence reading through Reading Journals and keep them in their book bags.
- Reading books should be taken home every night and brought back the next day to use in Phonics lessons.
- Finding opportunities to write at home.
- Supporting your child with number formation.
- Reading is the priority. Ask your child questions about the text, encourage them to reread sentences to build fluency and help them "chunk" longer words e.g. gardening read as gar-den-ing, in three parts.
- **Bedtime stories**: children listening to you read is a great time to relax and bond and it is so beneficial to children and aids their imagination.

READING & PHONICS



- We will begin Year doing a phonics Phase 5 review during Term I before moving on to fluency and comprehension.
- Little Wandle reading books will be sent home every Friday for those children who need to catch-up with their phonics or who are on the bridge between phase 5 and banded books. They will be assessed termly, once ready they will be moved onto banded books. Others will independently select their own banded books.
- Please encourage reading of non-school books at home too.
- Children will also have the opportunity to choose a library book in our library session when it is completed, which they may choose to read during our DEAR reading sessions.
- Children who did not pass their phonics screen will re- take it at the end of year 2.

A FEW REMINDERS...

- Please remember to check the school calendar and weekly newsletter for updates. The classroom door is always open too.
- Please feel free to message me on Class Dojo.
- Please ensure consistently check arbour for trip updates and payments.
- Please check if you are eligible for free school meals- this may be helpful for your family as the cost of living increases.
- This also provides the school with extra money to be spent on resources and experiences for the children, such as equipment or trips.
- Please communicate with the office for absences- not Class Dojo.
- As much as possible an adult will be on the Year 2 gate each morning if you need to discuss anything.

Parents and Carers agree to:

- Respect and trust the decisions made by the school regarding my child's provision and speak to us directly if you have any queries.
- Read and respond when necessary to communication which comes from the school.

Parental Conduct
